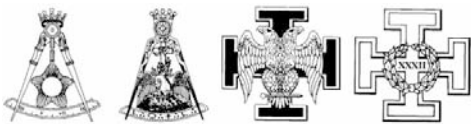

Work, Work, Work! Bringing Back Our Beautiful Temple!

ROOF: Almost completed, and looking good. Sunrise Roofing has done a great job so far! They actually had to remove what looked like a sod roof over the stage control room, there really weren't too many places where the underlayment or the membrane were not pretty much rotted. No wonder the roof was leaking! With a twenty year warranty, we should not have to worry about water dripping into our beautiful building anymore.

DRAINS: One of the main problems with our roof all along has been the drain system. At some point, we think that some of the original tar roof melted into the drains. Over the years it hardened into chunks. In the process of replacing the roof, it was necessary to clean out these drains so that the roofers could finish their work. The contractor was tenacious in doing his job! We have thirty-four drains on our roof and they are all now working like they are supposed to.

CHARLOTTE SCOTTISH RITE THEATER: We are currently talking with the Firebird Arts Alliance and Opera Carolina about bringing events to our facility. This will give us some much needed revenue, but more importantly it will allow the public to see a part of what the Scottish Rite is all about. Events are in the planning stages now! Hopefully we'll be able to let you know a little more in the next newsletter!

Charlotte's Scottish Rite Temple Opens to Public (this appeared recently as an ad in the "Hospitality News")

The white brick building on Randolph Road is no longer for sale. The membership of Charlotte's Scottish Rite Masons voted recently to take the building off the market and engage in a preservation project to bring it back to its "days of glory" when it was first built in 1978. Back then, the membership bulged beyond 9,000, so they built a large 40,000+ square foot facility with a full size commercial kitchen and dining hall that can seat over 500 people. In addition there is a theater with tiered and balcony seating and a full production stage that can seat over 900! Today, membership has declined to around four thousand, so the need to utilize all of that space is not the necessity that it once was. According to Tom Stroozas, General Secretary and long-time Scottish Rite Mason, the facility is overbuilt for our current membership needs. "Yes, we are losing members, but so are religious and other fraternal organizations. But in spite of that, we are not going out of business". So in an effort to share the building's beauty, mystery and amenities with the general public, the Charlotte Scottish Rite has decided to open the facility up for special community and theatrical events. In addition to being a place of Masonic teaching and fellowship for its Masonic members, the Charlotte Scottish Rite of Freemasonry funds



and operates an on-site Children's Learning Center. The center caters to elementary and middle school children who are experiencing difficulties with reading and written language that can so often interfere with their academic achievement.

The Learning Center's mission is to equip these children with the skills and strategies necessary to reach their full potential as successful, independent learners. The services to the children and their families are absolutely free of charge, courtesy of the Scottish Rite members and other donations received from foundations and individuals. So now that the "secret" is unveiled! Children's Learning Center - December 2007 Happenings

CHILDREN SERVED 32, Therapy sessions 84, 28 sessions per week, 21 children seen in our Center, Evaluations 3, Conferences held regarding former, current or perspective students 12, Perspective Students' Intakes 7

DONATIONS, MEMORIALS AND GRANTS: During December, we received \$5,604.62 in monetary gifts to our Center. These gifts included parent donations, donations sent in by Scottish Rite members with their dues and a grant from Wal-Mart. Many thanks are given to everyone who has supported our work. We are also very thankful for our parents and families who continue to help whenever they can by donating their time, candy, prizes and supplies.

For the first time ever, our Center brought in more revenue than our yearly budget expenditures including salaries. Through the generosity of members and parents with the Ellis Lucas estate gift, a grant, grocery and store rebates, matching gifts, the Roger Hart Golf Tournament, memorials and donations, we have raised a total of \$97,810.32 in 2007. Some of the funds given have been invested for future support. We will continue working to seek financial support for the great work being done at the Charlotte Scottish Rite Children's Learning Center.

OTHER NEWS FROM YOUR CHILDREN'S LEARNING CENTER: We end 2007 with grateful hearts for the opportunities for learning that we have been able to provide through this Center. Your Scottish Rite Children's Learning Center evaluated 20 children in 2007 providing parents with testing results, insight into why their child is struggling, and recommendations to help their child overcome their learning problems. Your Center provided over 1,305 individual therapy sessions to 40 deserving students in 2007. Because of your support, many young people are succeeding academically in ways they didn't know were possible and feeling much more positive about their futures and the possibilities that lie ahead. Thank you from your staff and all of the families whose lives you have touched. Happy New Year to all of you! We look forward to another great year in 2008!
